

A Royal Truth: Reflection on the Solemnity of Christ the King.

What's the truth Jesus comes to bear witness to in this last Gospel of the Church's year?

It's the truth that in Jesus God keeps the promise He made to David of an everlasting kingdom, of an heir who would be His Son, "the first born, highest of the kings of the earth" (see 2 Samuel 7:12-16; Psalm 89:27-38).

Today's Second Reading, taken from the Book of Revelation, quotes these promises and celebrates Jesus as "the faithful witness." The reading hearkens back to Isaiah's prophecy that the Messiah would "witness to the peoples" that God is renewing His "everlasting covenant" with David (see Isaiah 55:3-5).

But as Jesus tells Pilate, there's far more going on here than the restoration of a temporal monarchy. In the Revelation reading, Jesus calls Himself "the Alpha and the Omega," the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. He's applying to Himself a description that God uses to describe Himself in the Old Testament—the first and the last, the One who calls forth all generations (see Isaiah 41:4; 44:6; 48:12).

"He has made the world," today's Psalm cries, and His dominion is over all creation (see also John 1:3; Colossians 1:16-17). In the vision of Daniel we hear in today's First Reading, He comes on "the clouds of heaven"—another sign of His divinity—to be given "glory and kingship" forever over all nations and peoples.

Christ is King and His kingdom, while not of this world, exists in this world in the Church. We are a royal people. We know we have been loved by Him and freed by His blood and transformed into "a kingdom, priests for his God and Father" (see also Exodus 19:6; 1 Peter 2:9).

As a priestly people, we share in His sacrifice and in His witness to God's everlasting covenant. We belong to His truth and listen to His voice, waiting for Him to come again amid the clouds.


2021 Catholic Ministries Appeal for St. Gertrude's: Goal: \$55,000.

Dear Parishioners;

May I please take this opportunity to keep you updated in regard to the life of our parish. As you all are so very much aware, the center of our lives as Catholics is our worship of God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit in the celebration of the Lord’s self-gift of His life upon the cross which we share daily in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and especially on the Lord’s Day of Sunday. No other act that we do is more important than celebrating this mystery at Mass in our parish each day. Each Sunday and on solemn Feast Days as well as for funerals and weddings, this offering of the Mass is splendidly surrounded by music, ritual and prayers.

At this time, unfortunately, I am sorry to inform you that our church organ is no longer able to be repaired. It is inoperable.

Our parish organist, Barbara Bixby has graciously been using her own keyboard to support our singing the Lord’s praises, this however, is not sufficient or adequate for our worship.

You will notice this weekend that we have been able to lease for a limited time, a rental organ that has been placed in the front of the church by the piano. This will support our worship and praise for the time being.

It is my hope to purchase a new organ for our worship here in church. A new electronic organ will cost in the range of \$40 to \$50 thousand dollars.

This huge expense has not been calculated into our budget or the Church Renovation Campaign. Along with the Parish Finance Committee, I will continue to review this situation. Obviously this unforeseen expense will have an effect on the continued plans for our renovation particularly in regard to the expansion of our handicap parking area and the other projects planned.

I will certainly keep the parish informed as we move ahead.

May I thank you for your support of the parish and for the Campaign.

I promise to continue to serve you to the best of my ability as your pastor and ask for your continued prayers and support.
