TODAY'S READINGS

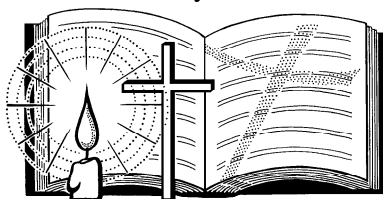
First Reading – The LORD said to Abram: All the families of the earth shall find blessing in you (Genesis 12:1-4a)

Second Sunday of Lent

Listen to Him: Reflection on the Second Sunday of Lent:

Today's Gospel portrays Jesus as a new and greater Moses.

Moses also took three companions up a mountain and on the seventh day was overshadowed by the shining cloud of God's presence. He too spoke with God and his face and clothing were made radiant in the encounter (see Exodus 24, 34).

But in today's Lenten liturgy, the Church wants us to look back past Moses. Indeed, we are asked to contemplate what today's Epistle calls God's "design . . . from before time began."

With His promises to Abram in today's First Reading, God formed the people through whom He would reveal Himself and bestow His blessings on all humanity.

He later elevated these promises to eternal covenants and changed Abram's name to Abraham, promising that he would be father of a host of nations (see Genesis 17:5). In remembrance of His covenant with Abraham He raised up Moses (see Exodus 2:24; 3:8), and later swore an everlasting kingdom to David's sons (see Jeremiah 33:26).

In Jesus' transfiguration today, He is revealed as the One through whom God fulfills His divine plan from of old.

Not only a new Moses, Jesus is also the "beloved son" promised to Abraham and again to David (see Genesis 22:15-18; Psalm 2:7; Matthew 1:1).

Moses foretold a prophet like him to whom Israel would listen (see Deuteronomy 18:15, 18) and Isaiah foretold an anointed servant in whom God would be well-pleased (see Isaiah 42:1). Jesus is this prophet and this servant, as the Voice on the mountain tells us today.

By faith we have been made children of the covenant with Abraham (see Galatians 3:7-9; Acts 3:25). He calls us, too, to a holy life, to follow His Son to the heavenly homeland He has promised. We know, as we sing in today's Psalm, that we who hope in Him will be delivered from death.

So like our father in faith, we go forth as the Lord directs us: "Listen to Him!"

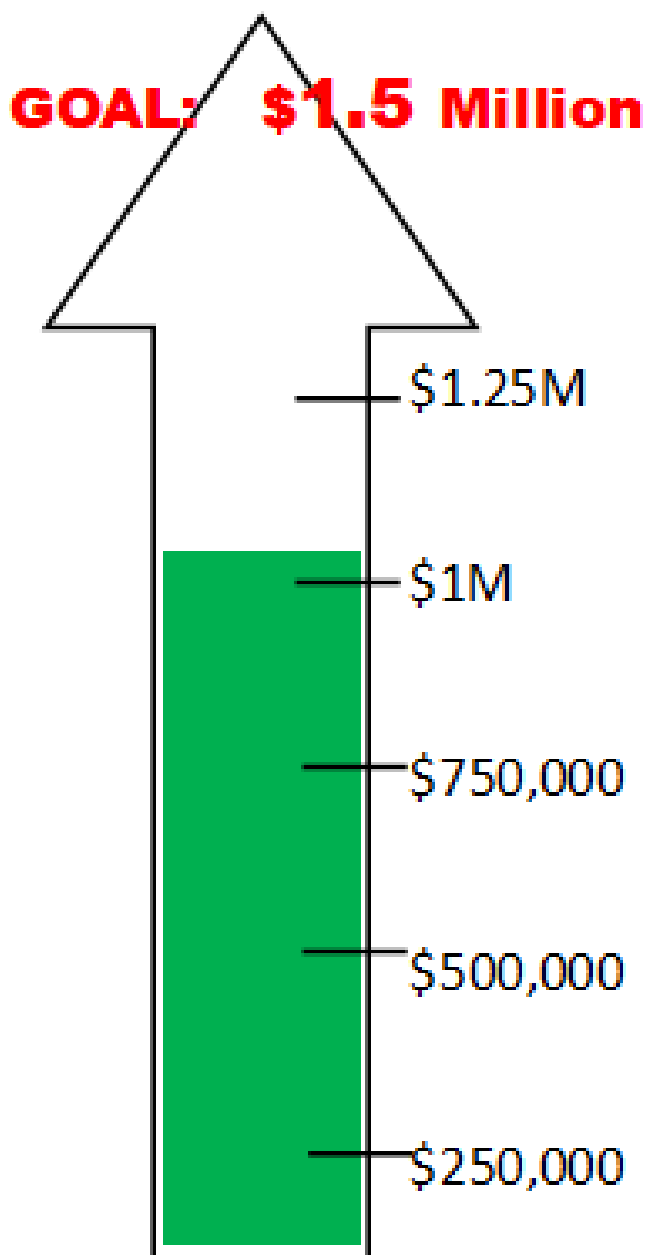

With deep joy I am pleased to share with you the announcement made this morning in the Vatican that His Holiness Pope Francis has given the Diocese of Rockville Centre a new auxiliary bishop. Please join me in prayerfully congratulating Idente Missionary Father Luis Miguel Romero as the new Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

We will celebrate the centenary of Saint John Paul II's birth on May 18, 2020. In his Apostolic Exhortation on the role of the bishop in the Church entitled *Pastores Gregis* (2003), he writes: "The pastoral ministry received in episcopal consecration, which sets the bishop 'before' the other faithful, finds expression in his 'being for' the other members of the faithful while not detracting from his 'being with' them." I cannot think of a better description of Bishop-elect Romero's pastoral charity and leadership, and his humble and joyful missionary spirit. It will be a joy to ordain him a Bishop.

With a humble spirit, Bishop-elect Romero is a true intellectual with the 'smell of the sheep'. He is a global churchman who lives the Idente missionary charism in an inspirational way. Bishop-elect Romero has an exceptional capacity, with his extensive academic background in religion and science, to address how the truths of the Catholic faith in regard to the Gospel of Life, Catholic Social Justice teaching and the Church's advocacy in history of ethical scientific development need to be brought directly and compellingly into the public square.

Bishop-elect Romero's pastoral artistry and evangelizing leadership as pastor of the Parish of Our Lady of Loretto in Hempstead will translate well in his new role of assisting me and my brother bishops in the pastoral care of the diocese, tending to the pastoral and spiritual needs of a diverse population of more than 1.4 million Catholics. He will continue to serve as the recently appointed Vicar for Hispanic Ministry and Evangelization.

On the parish level, Bishop-elect Romero has embraced the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' National Encuentro process. His hands-on Encuentro experience can serve as an example to many of the 133 parishes in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

I wish to express my deepest thanks to the Holy Father for this appointment to help pastor this, the eighth largest diocese in the nation.

COME MEET PAUL MONTENERO SPEAKING ON:
**Who is Being Called in Caravaggio's,
"The Calling of Saint Matthew"**



Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio (known simply as Caravaggio), was one of the main artists who pioneered the new style in Italian art known as Baroque. In Rome, in the Costarelli Chapel of the Church of St. Louis of the French, you will see what many consider his finest painting: "The Calling of Saint Matthew." The scene brings the moment where Jesus called Matthew to follow him to a sudden standstill. In this frozen scene, Caravaggio illuminates numerous messages about being called and the one calling us. Many who have discerned a call to serve God, pray in front of an image of this masterpiece (including our presenter!). Like the chiaroscuro style he mastered so well, Caravaggio's life was a struggle between his immoral deeds and the deeply spiritual works he created.



PAUL MONTENERO'S BIO

Paul Montenero has produced and delivered many different Catholic themed art presentations to several parishes and organizations. He has used art to bring many closer to God by deepening the experience of prayer in topics such as: the Stations of the

Cross, the theology of the Crucifixion, and the history and mystery of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The art of Caravaggio has been a favorite of Paul's, and he has studied this particular piece extensively. Paul is nearing the completion of his MA in Theology at the Immaculate Conception Seminary, where he has incorporated art into many of his term papers and essays. Paul is the editor of *The MISTY* newsletter for his Knights of Columbus Council, which has won the top award for Suffolk County multiple times, and he is a regular contributor to his parish bulletin. As a computer consultant and teacher, he is an expert on the use of programs such as PowerPoint, which he employs to enliven his art presentations.

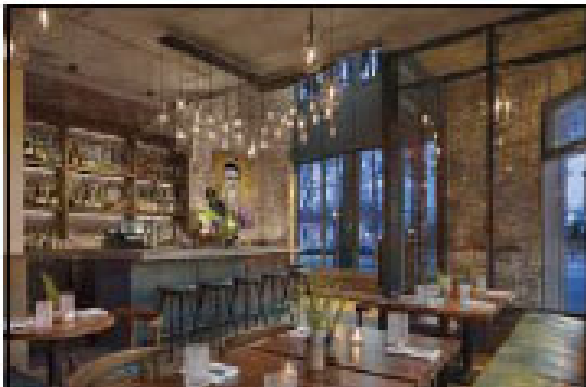

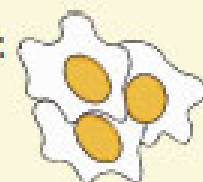

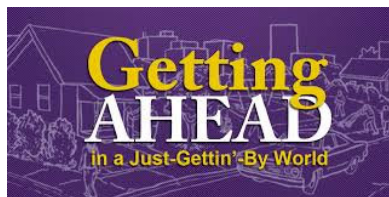
FAMILY, MARRIAGE AND INDIVIDUAL THERAPY

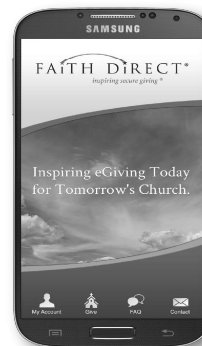

The *IRA Charitable Rollover* is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift

Your IRA is a traditional or Roth

You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift must go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.
